# The Journey to Missions

People always ask, "How are you doing? Are you excited about Colombia?". On the inside I'm laughing saying, "you have no idea". Every day is like waking up from an amazing dream and realizing it wasn't a dream. I am constantly pausing to remind myself, "this is real, I am a missionary." God spoke so clearly to my heart when I was 13 about missions. I was at an altar call, in a little church, on the Baja Peninsula of Mexico. I responded saying God you speak, whatever you want I will do. He said, "this". From that moment on my heart was content.

I continued doing missions short term for many years. I attended, then, Valley Forge Christian College majoring in World Missions. I prayed and God brought Isaiah into my life. I now continued this journey with Isaiah by my side, missions always being the goal. We started in youth ministry together, after



college. We have now been in youth and children's ministry for over 12 years.

There were times on the journey where I had to stop and be honest; asking God to confirm again what he spoke to me when I was a teen. Years past, church positions came and went. It felt at times like God's words spoken to my heart were never going to happen. There are still days that seem overwhelming with change as we prepare our, now, family of five to leave our home and move to a new country. The excitement and peace as I watch this promise come to life has calmed my heart; I am literally living my dream. This journey to missions if far from over, but every day is a new adventure in God's calling.
